ARTIST STATEMENT

I have always been a perfectionist.

As a child, I drew my straight lines with a ruler; I retied my two french braids over and over again until they looked perfectly symmetrical; I let my creativity roam via crayons, but only within the lines.

I'm still a perfectionist, but only in the sense that I care —very much— about the quality of work I produce. I like to ensure that everything I do is top-notch; one wrong measurement could mean the collapse of an entire set; one misplaced stitch could mean a costume malfunction on stage; one misguided camera setting could mean an entire picture, ruined. I find that my creativity and fastidiousness often complement each other, coming together to create something of quality that is at once reliable and artistic. I take pride in everything I do, which often means I will spend hours agonizing over the balance of a poster or drafting 13 copies of a design before a final rendering.

I want to be known as a creative individual whom people can rely on to produce things of high-caliber every. single. time. Caring about the quality of work I produce does not mean I am paralyzed with fear when I encounter the unknown; in fact, this shapes my attitude and excitement to excel at something else.
